



DIVERSION INFORMATION PACKET

You are currently charged with a criminal offense in the Lenexa Municipal Court. If this is your first offense, you may be eligible for diversion.

Diversion is an agreement between yourself and the City that gives you the opportunity to avoid a conviction in exchange for compliance with certain requirements.

The City Prosecutor has the sole discretion to grant diversion in Municipal Court, and may deny any application even if it is a first offense. If you would like to be considered for diversion, you must complete the following items:

- Obtain an Evaluation. (Request list of agencies from court clerk or at www.lenexa.com)**

If the offense you are charged with involves either drugs or alcohol, please contact an agency from the list of approved providers to schedule an appointment for a drug and alcohol evaluation. Please make your appointment promptly to ensure the evaluation will be available to the court as soon as possible. Failure to promptly provide an evaluation may result in denial of diversion. **If you are charged with a DUI offense you will be required to obtain an ADSAP Evaluation and not just a substance abuse evaluation.**

- Complete Diversion Application. (Attached)**

Please complete the attached two page diversion application and bring it with you to your next court date. Failure to provide accurate and truthful information in your diversion application may result in the denial of your diversion application, or revocation of your diversion once in place.

- Be prepared to proceed with your case.**

You have the right to an attorney. If you plan to have an attorney represent you, it is your responsibility to make sure that your attorney appears with you on your court date. If you cannot afford an attorney, the Court may appoint counsel to represent you. In that case, you will need to request an application for court appointed counsel for the Municipal Judge to review upon completion.

- Bring adequate funds to pay for diversion and other fees.**

At least half of the total fees must be paid when you sign the diversion agreement. The cost for a drug or alcohol diversion will be determined after meeting with a City Prosecutor.
